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INTERNAL RULES

History.

The International Association of Cycling Race Organisers was created on 19 October 1956, on the initiative of Organisers who wanted to join together to defend their interests with International Bodies.

It is an Association established under the French Act of 1901.

In accordance with Art. 19.1

The Management Board may draw up A.I.O.C.C. Internal Rules, aimed at facilitating the application of the current points not covered by these statutes.

The internal rules shall only be applicable after having been approved by the General Assembly ruling at an ordinary meeting. The same applies to any amendments.

III – ADMINISTRATION:

Art 8.3:

The Management Board includes twelve (12) members, including a President and a Secretary General, all elected for four years (4) and who may be re-elected, in accordance with the details provided in article 9.2 of these internal rules.

IV – MANAGEMENT BOARD:

Art. 9.2:

The Management Board is made up of twelve (12) members elected by A.I.O.C.C. members that meet at an extraordinary assembly every four (4) years in accordance with the quorum and majority rules stipulated in articles 17 and 18 of these statutes.

Only A.I.O.C.C. members in charge of the organisation of their race are eligible to be on the Management Board.

Applications to become a Management Board member must be presented individually and sent, by post, to the A.I.O.C.C. President, to the address of the Association's administrative headquarters at the latest 30 days BEFORE THE DATE of the General Assembly.

The letter of application must include:

- the applicant's surname
- first names (underline those normally used)
- private address
- valid UCI licence number on the date of the Assembly
- the race(s) represented

VI – GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

Art. 12.1:

Invitations shall be sent, with the agenda, by the A.I.O.C.C. Secretary General, at least 21 days before the date of the meeting.

To be approved, any individual proposal at the General Assembly must be sent by post or by email, at least 10 days before the date of the meeting (date sent being taken into account).

Art. 12.2:

At the General Assembly, each A.I.O.C.C. member, in a regular situation vis-a-vis the Association, has the right to one vote per race that it organises. The organisation of a long duration race gives the right to one (1) extra vote per four (4) race days from the first (1st) day included. The total number of votes granted for the same race may not exceed six (6).

This equates to:

1 to 3 day race	1 vote
4 to 7 day race	2 votes
8 to 11 day race	3 votes
12 to 15 day race	4 votes
16 to 19 day race	5 votes
20 days and +	6 votes

The right to vote shall not be granted to members who have not paid their affiliation fees within 2 working days after having received the invitation.

Postal votes are not permitted.

Proxy votes are permitted. However, each voter cannot submit any more than two (2) proxy votes.

Only **original** proxy votes – after verification – or sent by post to AIOCC sealed with the organisation's stamp, name and signature of the race representative and the name of the person appointed by proxy, shall be permitted.

These proxy votes must have been received by the AIOCC Secretary General – at its official administrative headquarters – at the latest 72 hours before the date of the vote.

No proxy votes will be accepted after this deadline.

Each «official» voter or «proxy bearer», shall indicate his/her vote on a blank document apart from:

- the alphabetical list of candidates
- AIOCC's official stamp

Members appointed to conduct the vote will hand over to voters, an envelope including a number of voting slips equal to the number of actual votes and/or by proxy – that the voter is entitled to.

The voter shall check the number of voting slips on receipt and shall sign the voting register in agreement.
